I am an artist; metalsmith and bookbinder. Currently I am working on a project called ! Elements ! Caring for our precious earth project.

I feel we all need to dig deeper to find connection with our precious earth and learn to care for it. I am attempting to do this literally by digging for the clay that underlies the topsoil layer in all 50 States and Territories of the United States, and hopefully eventually worldwide as well. I need your help!

I encourage you to join me! You can do this by sending me local clay samples. You also can make beautiful artworks using these precious earths and I encourage you to find ways to deepen your commitment stewardship to the elements, and enjoying their inherent beauties.

I will be using the clays to make pigments for paste papers - a long established art form of making decorative papers used for the covering and end papers on books.

Do you, or someone you know have a location you could dig deep enough to get to some clay and send me 3 pounds (equivalent to two or three peanut butter jars packed full). If you can, I would prefer to have you send this in recyclable plastic jars or bags, so they do not break in shipping and use! I intend to re-purpose these containers to make tools to create the papers! What I do not use will be recycled. Two or three pounds of clay would give me enough material to refine the particle size so that it makes a good colorant for the paste.

Is there any cultural heritage that you, your region, events, rituals or beliefs that you participate in that I might miss during my general research about your location? Would you mind answering a couple of biographical questions to accompany your clay samples? It would be interesting to find out a little background behind the clays and the people who generously donated their time and efforts to make this project possible! It could be a way to add to your contribution to make this a more meaningful and personal group project.

Along with the postage reimbursement, I would also like to send you a Gratitude Gift of a small handmade journal made by me using my local Maryland clay as the pigment for the paste paper on its covers, and a sample of hand made paper using recycled paper and fabric pulp or repurposed fabrics as a thanks for your generous donation to this project.
